**RESOLUTION AMEND PERSONNEL POLICY 4-100
ADDING JUNETEENTH (JUNE 19) AS AN OFFICIAL
COUNTY HOLIDAY**

WHEREAS, June 19 has now been designated a federal holiday in commemoration of the emancipation of enslaved people in the United States: and

WHEREAS, the State of Utah has recently, by law, adopted June 19 as a state holiday: June Nineteenth National Freedom Day; and

WHEREAS, the Rich County Board of Commissioners determines that commemorating June Nineteenth National Freedom Day is in the County's best interests: and

WHEREAS, the County's personnel policy manual sets out the official holidays in which the County's offices close; and

WHEREAS, the County Commission has the authority to establish holidays that will be observed in the County's offices.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, the Rich County Board of Commissioners adopts June Nineteenth National Freedom Day (June 19) as an official County holiday.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Rich County Board of Commissioners amends Personnel Policy 4-100, Holidays to reflect the change.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Board of Commissioners removes Columbus Day from the list of County holidays where County offices will close.
